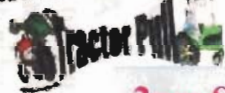

Be a part of the Harlem Heritage Parade! Saturday, August 21 at 10:00 A.M.

The Harlem Township Bicentennial celebration will take place on August 21 and 22 at the Community Park across from the Fire Station on State Route 605. The celebration will include a parade led by the first family to permanently settle in what became Harlem Township. Benajah and Cassandra Cook, with some of their children, will ride in a Conestoga wagon pulled by Percheron horses, around the track at the Park, followed by other historical figures, and residents of the township (and their friends).

Children of all ages are invited to join the parade! **We'll be handing out goodie bags to kids who decorate their bicycles, tricycles, and wagons, or who create a small float to pull in the parade.** You can enter in any of several categories, according to your own interests. The categories are the Green and Gold Theme (in honor of the old Harlem School colors), the Historical Theme (any period of history that interests you), and the Safety Theme (because safety is always important!).
