“Life Is Far Too Short”

Partner With God In What Matters Most

My brother Bob (whose picture sits on the end table in my office) and I were very close when I was a young boy. He was ten years my elder, and I was always elated when he allowed me to hang out with him. At times I was allowed to camp out with him. On other occasions just he and I would take a ride in his 1965 Mercury; somehow I felt all ‘grown up’ riding shotgun with my big brother. On several adventures we shared, he communicated his love for me...and I knew I was special in his life.

But life changed, as it often does, and I grew up. He was married, I was married, and we were both doing our best for our families and our homes. To this day I’m not sure what happened, but somewhere along the line we had a major disagreement about something and our relationship became strained. We were cordial with each other, but only on a surface social level. As I look back, we lost several years of relationship because of this disagreement...years that can’t be restored.

Then one day my brother Larry called me to tell me that Bob’s daughter, Mandi, had been in a terrible car crash. She was in I.C.U. in Pittsburgh and not expected to live. Without even thinking I dropped everything and drove across I-70. I knew my brother needed me.

Many years of troubled relationship were erased in that initial embrace as I held by older brother and he sobbed. We went to the chapel and prayed...and miraculously, Mandi survived. As the days went by, Mandi healed, my relationship with my brother healed, and at times we would spend an hour on the phone together. One day he shared deeply from his heart. *“Bud, now I understand why you are a Pastor. I have just completed a weekend where I have come to know Jesus in my life like never before.”* To my thrill, Bob had been reconciled with God through Jesus Christ at the Roman Catholic version of our Walk to Emmaus Weekends. For the first time ever, Bob and I prayed together thanking God for what He had done in our lives. We were at peace. We were reunited in Christ as more than earthly brothers; now made brothers in Christ. And I’m so thankful. Later that year, Bob passed from this life at age fifty in a very unexpected, and untimely death. It was a most emotional and difficult experience to speak at his funeral.

I learned that life is too short. It’s far too short to take for granted...and it’s far too short to waste on things that don’t really matter or have little eternal significance. Harlem Road U.M.C. is at a wonderful crossroad of opportunity that will have an eternal significance for you and me, and for the hundreds and thousands that will come after us. *“Partnering With God”*, our upcoming campaign, will enable us to pay down/off our building investment, and will empower us to continue building bridges of new ministry to reach the lost and equip the saved. Given that life is short, the Lord’s work should be our highest priority. I feel so passionate about *“Partnering With God”*, that I have adopted 2nd Samuel 24:24 as my personal theme verse: *“I will not offer to God, that which costs me nothing.”*

Following this principal, Pam and I will give to this campaign, an amount equal to our tithe for the General Fund, and we will push beyond that an additional percentage. We will not neglect our responsibility to support the daily cost of ministry at HRC, and we will find ways to give above and beyond that for the eternal importance of *“Partnering With God.”*

We have made a commitment to give sacrificially. I challenge you to do the same. Seek God’s direction in prayer. Ask Him what you should do in faith. Then decide what you can do without in order to give a sacrificial offering. We have decided that nothing is more important in our lives than reaching the lost men, women, and children all around this place where God has placed us. We are thrilled to be a part of this incredible, worthy, eternal project; I hope you are too. The opportunity will be in front of us within the next 45 days...Please begin to pray now asking God to show you His will.

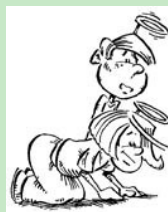

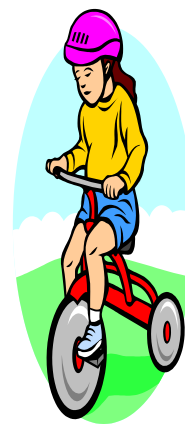

SUNDAY MORNING CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them..."

Matt 19:14

Jesus has given a mandate to bring His children into His presence. At Harlem Road Church, we're working on doing just that. Children need their own personal experiences with Christ to cement a relationship with Him that will carry them into their future. We want to provide ways for those experiences to take place. In 2010-2011, we will be working with curriculum from Group Publishing and Kids In Ministry, International. Our desire is to bring our children into a deeper understanding of their faith in Christ. Here's how Sunday mornings unfold for this program year:

8:30am – 9:30am – Room 107 – Children begin in the Family Life Center with their families – and then go to Room 107. Parents, please pick up your child immediately following the 8:30 service. If you're staying for Sunday school, please notify the teacher and those children staying will head to the Promiseland Rooms.

9:45am – 10:30am – Promiseland Rooms – Since we have our lesson times during the main worship services, the children begin the Sunday school time with games, crafts & fun-time. Parents, please pick your children up promptly at 10:30am in the Promiseland rooms. (During descent weather, we will be outside on the playground.)

11:00am – 12:00pm – Family Life Center – Chapel – Classrooms. Children begin in the Family Life Center with their families – and then are dismissed during the offering to the Chapel. We will all gather in the Chapel for our Sunday school opening and then dismiss to age-appropriate classrooms. Parents, please pick up your child in their individual classrooms immediately following the 11am service.

Sunday Morning Nursery Care

Nursery care for children will continue throughout Sunday morning. Parents, please sign your child into the attendance book – make sure your diaper bag is marked with your child's name. Please pick your child up immediately after the worship service.

9:45am – 10:30am: Children age newborn to 3 years old.

11:00am – noon: Children age newborn to 2 years old.
